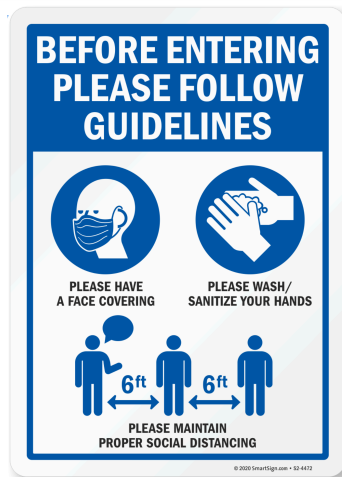

IN ORDER FOR US TO STAY OPEN - We each need to be vigilant in doing what we can to slow down the spread of Covid. We can do that by:

1. Wearing a face covering
2. Distancing at least six feet
3. Sanitizing hands
4. No hugs or handshakes
